Developing your soft skills / transferrable skills ready for the world of work



It is important to recognise and embrace every opportunity to develop these skills and then connect these skills to the world of work and your ideal career path.

Student Aspirations Survey

Each Autumn term you will be invited to complete an aspirational survey during R-time which enables school staff to become aware of your career related interests and aspirations. Being aware of this information allows us as a school to support you in achieving your goals and ambitions and to take the right steps towards your chose career path.



That current research suggests that our current cohort of young people in society will have, on average, between 7 and 12 jobs during their working lives in up to four different career sectors.

Jobs which once may have needed people in order to operate are slowly becoming obsolete due to a variety of factors, such as:

- The introduction of automatic computerised self-running systems.
- Changes in the workplace such as remote working.
- The increased use of modern technology, robots and AI in the work place.

You will have a lot of factors to consider when it comes to the world of work during your adult life.

Is it time to start researching?

There are quite a few quizzes available online that will ask you lots of questions, and from your results suggest jobs that might suit you or identify strengths or skills you have that will be useful in future study or work.

These quizzes may help you find out more about lots of jobs that might suit you. But remember, the quizzes are just to help you start thinking about what is important to you, and the results are just a suggestion of things you might find interesting, so take the results as a guide rather than a perfect fit!

You will need to explore the suggested jobs in detail to see if they are really what you want.

Attention all students - do you have an igo pass?

If you are aged 11 to 16, you must have an igo card to travel using any child ticket on buses in Greater Manchester.

You can also use your igo card as proof of age for travelling by tram with a child ticket. You will need proof of age ID from age 11 on Metrolink.

To qualify for an igo card you must be:

- aged between 5 and 16
- be a permanent resident of, or go to school in, Greater Manchester

An igo card costs £10 and lasts until 31 August after your 16th birthday.

Attention Year 11 - do you know to apply for an OUr pass when you leave school?

Our Pass is a membership scheme for young people who live in Greater Manchester and supports both school leavers and care leavers.

An Our Pass gives you free bus travel across Greater Manchester on most local buses, any day of the week. You can also get half-price off-peak 1 day and weekend travelcards on Metrolink.

This membership also unlocks exclusive offers and experiences such as discounts, special offers, free tickets, swimming and leisure passes, merchandise, taster sessions and much more.

An our pass costs £10 and can be used for up to two years, starting from 1 September after your 16th birthday, until 31 August after your 18th birthday (or until your 18th birthday, if this is 31 August).

You can apply from 3 May in year 11 and can use your card automatically from 1 September. You will need to register for a website account separately to access exclusives.
