REMEMBERING QUEEN ELIZABETH II

Elizabeth Alexandra Mary, commonly known as Queen Elizabeth II, has sadly passed away at the age of 96 and to commemorate and celebrate her life here at the Derby High School, we will be dedicating this article to her.

Queen Elizabeth was seen as one of the greatest icons of the United Kingdom. During and after her life, Queen Elizabeth has been one of the most widely popular person in Britain and the rest of the world.

Queen Elizabeth II was the longest reigning monarch in British History of United Kingdom and 14 other countries in the commonwealth including Australia, Canada or New Zealand. Born in 1926 on the 21st of April, the Queen was the first-born child of Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother and King George VI. Four years after her birth, her sister Princess Margaret was born.

In 1947, Prince Phillip Mountbatten married the Queen. The happy marriage lasted for over 70 years until 2021 when the Prince unfortunately passed away. Before his death, Phillip enjoyed spending time with his 4 children and creating memories which he shared with the Queen.

Elizabeth became the Queen after the death of her father in the year 1952. Her coronation was held on the 2nd June 1953 at the age of 25 in Westminster Abbey.

This year we celebrated the Queen's platinum jubilee celebrating 70 years of her reign. There were remarkable performances honoring her hard work and her resilience as a monarch.

Overall, the Queen was and still is one of the most inspirational figures of our generation. She has inspired many and will be remembered by our generation.

Some may hate loud noises and bright scenes, and some may love that. Everyone has their own opinions just like the group of provincial English Catholics and most importantly Guido Fawkes (also known as Guy Fawkes). On the 5th of November, a historical and vibrant event takes place lighting up the United Kingdom with appreciation for stopping an assassination attempt to kill King James I by Guy Fawkes and the provincial English Catholics. Luckily, he was stopped and sentenced to death. Some people make scarecrows of Guy Fawkes and burn that in a fire whilst some watch or actually do fireworks.

This day was also known as the gunpowder plot, which was led by Robert Catesby, that occurred in 1605. The group of Catholics planned to blow up the houses of parliament in London to kill the King. During the early hours of the 5th of November Guy Fawkes was guarding explosives when an anonymous letter was given to the authorities in order to search Westminster Palace. They found Guy Fawkes in the basement and took him for questioning and was tortured until he confessed to what he was doing there. On the 8th of November he confessed that he wanted the King killed and that someone else should take the throne. He didn't name all of his accomplices but most of them. On January the 27th 1606 in Westminster Hall Fawkes and the conspirators were all convicted and sentenced to death. The executions took place on the 30th and 31st of January where there was hanging, drawing and quartering. Guy Fawkes was killed on the 31st. This is why most people burn effigies of Guy Fawkes in bonfires to signify the events that took place on 5th of November.
