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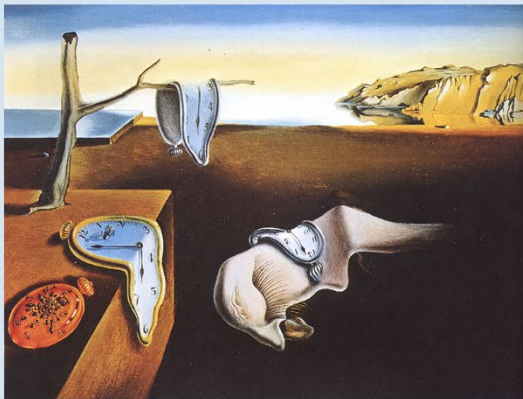
ART AND TEXTILES

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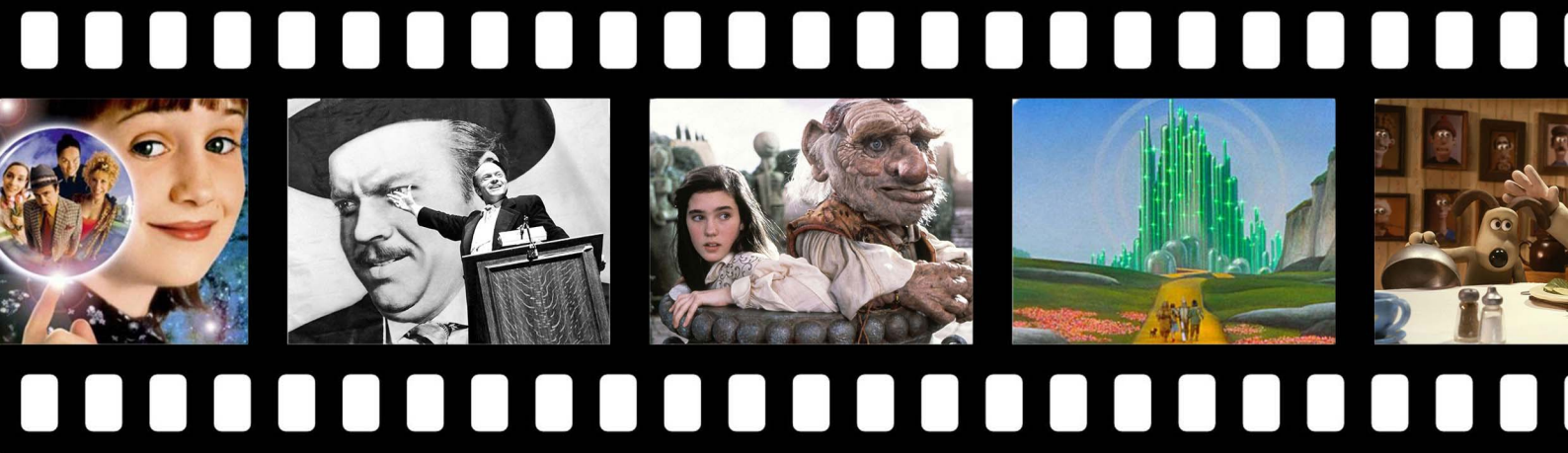
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FILM CLUB

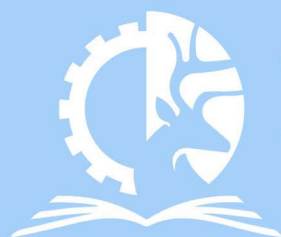

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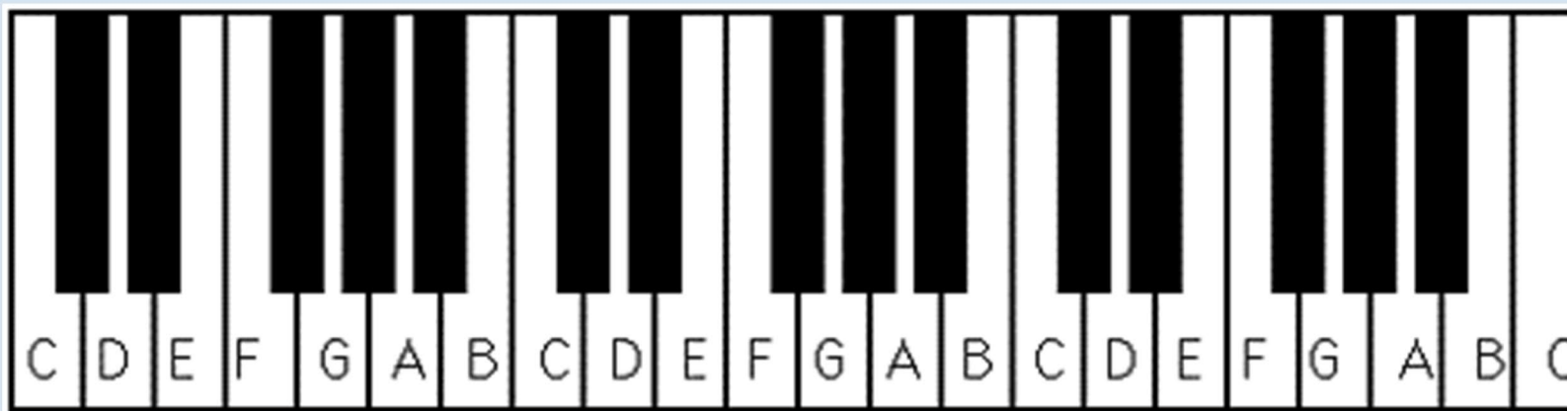

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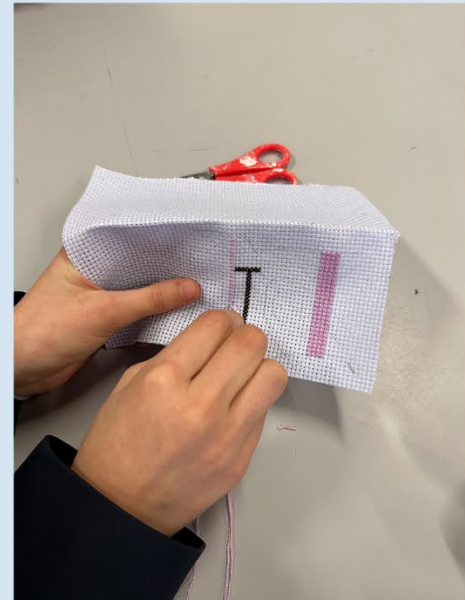

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LIBRARY ASSISTANT TEAM

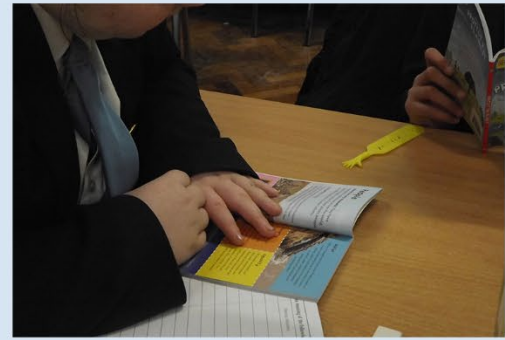

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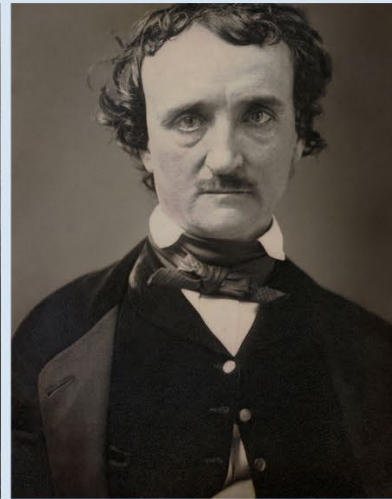
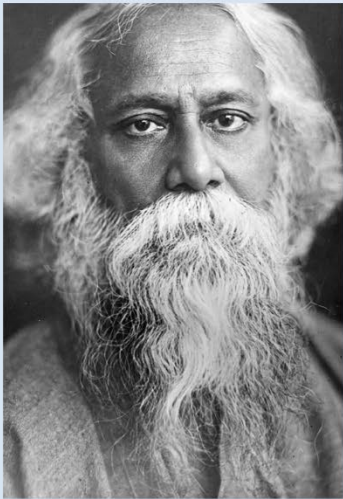
PASSION FOR POETRY

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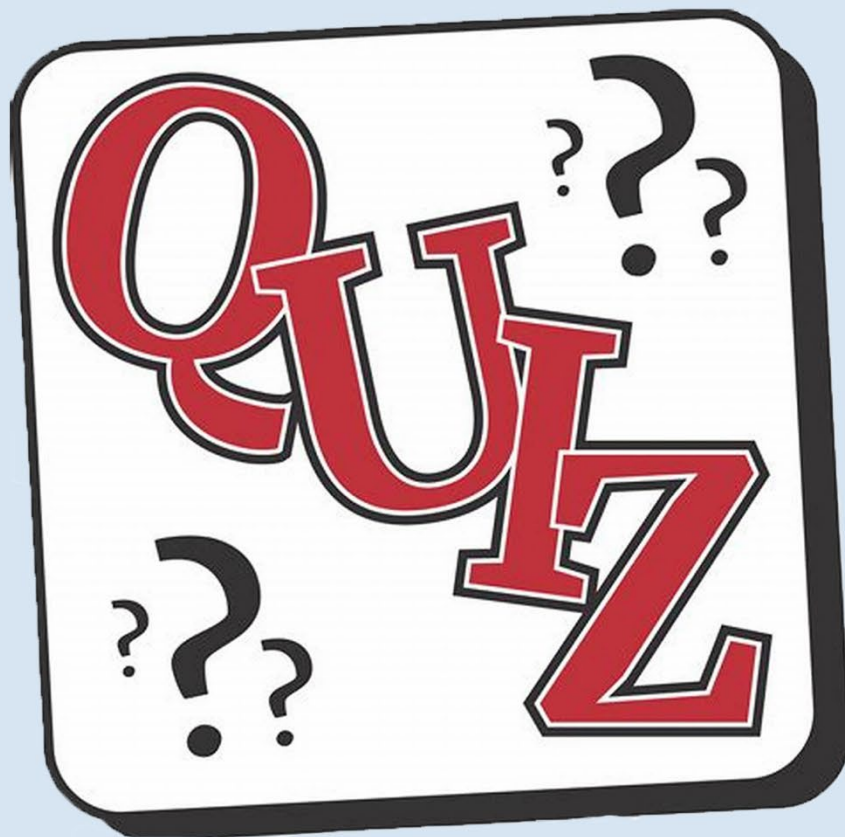

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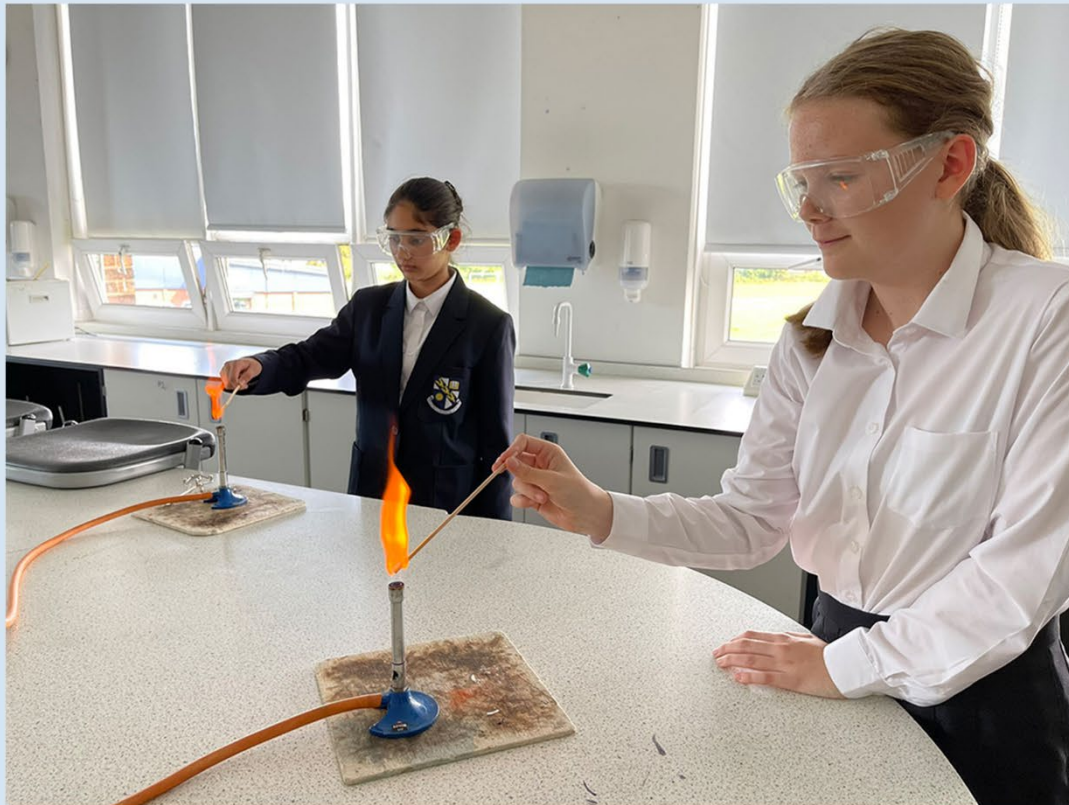
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STEM CLUB
