GCSE/ BTEC Results

Once again, we were really delighted with our GCSE results, with students making great progress from their start here in Year 7. We had students attaining eight Grade 9s (less than 3 in 10,000 students would be expected to achieve this) to students achieving more than 3 and 4 grades higher in their GCSEs than their SATs data would have predicted. These successes do not come without considerable hard work and 'Our Class of 2024' worked hard to secure their results and should feel incredibly proud of themselves. I am hugely grateful for the commitment and dedication of our staff and the support parents/carers provide for their child and the school.

School Environment

Over the summer, we made significant changes to the corridors to ease some of the congestion we face during lesson changeovers. There is also new flooring on each floor. We have reconfigured some old offices opposite the side entrance to the school to become a Student Services area. We now have a medical room in this space and parents will come here to collect their child if required during the school day. More information will follow once the building work has been completed.















Parking

We ask that all parents/carers park responsibly when dropping off and collecting their children either before or after school. To ensure everyone's safety please do not park in the restricted areas at the front of school or obstruct the school crossing patrol.

Also, please remember that students should not be driven down the main school driveway at the start and end of the school day. If you feel there is a specific reason why you may need to use the school drive at these times, please let the school know and a pass will be issued if required.

Uniform

Overwhelmingly students have returned fully compliant with our uniform policy, looking smart and in the correct uniform and with the correct equipment. Please be aware that details of our school uniform expectations can be found in our student planner and on our school website. Student planners also have a full list of equipment that students need to have with them in school each day. A reminder that we have a no make—up and no piercings policy and that students are required to have natural hair colours including on hair extensions and weaves. We ask that parents support the school in ensuring their child attends school adhering to our uniform policy.

Please be aware that where possible we will aim to rectify uniform issues in school by either providing students with the correct uniform or asking students to remove make-up/jewellery. We hope you will continue to work with us to ensure our students maintain our high expectations of uniform throughout the school year.

Attendance & Punctuality

We place a huge emphasis on attending school on time every day at The Derby High School. Our attendance target for all our students is 97% attendance or above. Please note that this is still the equivalent to 5 days absence over a year. Attendance figures at 90% are the equivalent to missing approximately four weeks of your child's educational entitlement and increases the risk of them falling behind their peers. The Government has increased fines for poor attendance from £60 per parent per child to £80. As a school we will continue to support families and our students to have the highest possible attendance and will only use fixed term penalty notices as a last resort. Students who arrive after registration has closed at 9.10am will incur an unauthorised absence for the morning session, so please ensure your child is arriving in school on time (8.35am for an 8.40am start).

Rewards will be given throughout the year for students who have consistently good attendance. Good attendance and punctuality will also be rewarded with access to various reward trips throughout the year.















Satchel - Homework App

We continue to make use of Satchel to set homework for all students. Students log-in using their school email address and password and parents simply need to enter a short parental code which has been sent home with students. If you are a Year 7 parent who has not yet received this code, please contact the school office who have a copy of codes for every child. Once this code has been entered, your account will be linked to your child's account. You can access Satchel through the website https://www.satchelone.com or by downloading the app for various mobile devices. The Satchel Help Centre contains a wide range of tutorials and video guides, and this can be found here - https://help.satchelone.com. Students also have a paper-based planner which can be used to record homework details and deadlines, but they are encouraged to use Satchel as their primary tool for homework organisation. This online tool makes it easier for them (and you) to keep track of their tasks and upcoming deadlines. We often receive communication asking for 'Satchel log-in details' for students. Please remind your child that they sign in using their school email address and password, even if they are accessing Satchel from home.

Homework

At The Derby High School, we strongly believe in the value of homework; to support students in their completion of homework tasks, we provide high-effort workspaces around school for students to make use of IT facilities and/or quietly complete paper-based activities. Our Homework Clubs are a supportive environment with staff on hand to provide support and guidance, both in terms of individual tasks and with a wider focus on time management and prioritisation. Homework Club takes place in A15 before school (8am onwards) and after school (until 4pm).

Study Clubs/ Revision/ Homework Club/ Library

<u>Homework Club</u> (8 am - 8.30 am <u>and</u> 3.05 pm - 4pm every day) - for all year groups in A15 (with staff supervision) (enter via the external door opposite the tennis courts)

<u>Year 11 'Brain Buffet'</u> (8 am – 8.30 every day) – in A12 and food and drink provided (with staff supervision) (enter via the external door opposite the tennis courts)

<u>Library</u> (The library is open every morning from 8.10 am, lunchtimes and most evenings until 3.55 pm. On days when the library needs to be closed students will always be directed to go to the other available study rooms) (in the morning enter via the main school entrance <u>with a pass</u>)











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Maths Sparx Club (3.05 pm - 4.00 pm every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday) - in A12

All these rooms give students access to computers and printers.

The Derby Diploma

The Derby Diploma allows us to credit students for the enrichment activities, clubs, and experiences they participate in. All students <u>must</u> participate in at <u>least one hour</u> of enrichment <u>each week</u>. Attendance at enrichment activities is closely monitored through students' weekly R-Time data sessions.

The Derby Diploma is an essential part of our school day. We believe that enrichment can extend the range of educational experiences for our students, broadening their horizons and helping them discover hidden talents by trying new things.

The Derby Challenge

At The Derby High School we value the academic success which our students historically experience and part of our strategy in securing these performances is a focus on the level of challenge across every classroom. These activities typically take the form of a more demanding task and we ask that you encourage your child to engage with these additional aspects as frequently as they feel able to. Furthermore, our Scholars Program continues to build on the bespoke events arranged for The Derby Challenge students outside of the classroom and our inclusive approach to stretch and challenge means that many of these events also cater for student involvement outside of the more able cohort. We have had a recent drive on ensuring that all The Derby Challenge students (and their parents) are aware of their involvement in the cohort.

Step 2: Enter the unique enrolment code and click 'Enrol'.
