Rewards

A reminder that there will be another rewards trip at the end of this term. Students with the highest number of achievement points and ATL Grade 4s during this term will be invited to attend on Wednesday 26th March from 3pm.

Ms Johnston will also soon be giving out letters for the Year 11 Blackpool Trip and the 'Class of 2025 Prom'. Again, students must ensure they have met the criteria to be able to attend these celebratory events. Only those students who are working towards our standards will receive a letter.

Study Support

We continue to offer quiet workspaces to support student study both before and after school, as well as at social times. The Library is available for all students during breaktime and lunchtime, as well as before and after school; please note that students can access the Library from 8am each morning and should do so through the main office entrance. We also offer Brain Buffet (Year 11) and morning Homework Club in A15. Both clubs run from 8am every day and access the school through the fire exit doors facing the tennis courts. A15 is also used after school (until 4pm) as our evening Homework Club. All students are welcome to attend, and the room contains computers which can be used to access Satchel and complete any work involving technology which students may not have available to them at home. Please also note that relevant staff (often Heads of Year or Form Tutors) might direct

















your child to attend Homework Club before and/or after school if they consistently fail to complete homework to the required standard or by agreed deadlines.

Behaviour

We currently have 955 students at The Derby High School, so it is vital that all in our school community abide by the expectations we have around behaviour. The Expectations and Consequences document, the 7 Rs and the Attitude to learning criteria can be found on our school website but I also want to highlight some key parts below and would ask for your support in maintaining the high standards of behaviour by reinforcing our expectations with your child.

Expectations and Consequences

Detentions

While we will always do our best to give notice of detentions, please note that schools are not required to do so. We will always consider how the young person can get home safely if they are detained with 'same day' or 'no notice' detentions.

Uniform and Equipment

We began our Spring Term ensuring that our high standards for uniform and equipment are adhered to. I would like to recognise the huge numbers of our students who follow our expectations and wear their uniform with pride each day and thank parents/carers for their ongoing support for these basic expectations.

Uniform /Equipment Reminders:

- A reminder that makeup (including false eyelashes and false nails) is prohibited as are piercings of any kind
- Unnatural hair colours are not permitted this includes extensions in those colours
- Hoodies are not permitted in any part of the school/school grounds
- Outdoor coats must not be worn in the building
- Your child must have a school bag
- They must have a pen (blue or black), a green pen, a sharpener, a pencil, a ruler, a rubber, a scientific calculator and a reading book each day

















Our main equipment issues centre around green pens, scientific calculators and a reading book. All these are essential items and will hold your child back if not brought each day. Please ensure your child has the required equipment.

Dropping off and collecting by car

A reminder that the school drive cannot be used to drop off or pick up your child. Passes have been given to a very limited number of parents/carers who need this access. They must be always displayed clearly on the dashboard. This is to ensure the safety of students and staff.

A plea to parents/carers for consideration when dropping off and collecting their child. We have a small number who are putting their own and other children at risk by parking at the front of school – often blocking the sight of vision for the school crossing patrol and neighbouring driveways. Please only park in areas where it is safe to do so.

Student Services

Our 'Student Services' team has relocated and now have their own designated entrance for students arriving late or needing to be collected from school before the end of the school day. The entrance is located at the left-hand side of the main school building.

The Derby App

The Derby App is the online application that we use for communication with parents/carers and is also an easy way to make payments online for school trips etc. If you haven't already done so we would encourage you to download the app as soon as possible. We are moving towards being a cashless school and eventually all payments will be made via our online system. If you have any questions or need any support in setting this up, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Curriculum and Assessment

All students have now completed their first summative assessments; Year 11 parents received their reports on Parents' Evening, Year 9 parents will receive theirs on Options Evening (Thursday 6th February) and Year 7, 8 and 10 parents will receive assessment data in the coming weeks. To find out more about what your child is studying this term, please visit the Curriculum page on our website; your support with their out-of-class learning will be vital in securing their continued success.

As referenced above, this is a particularly important term for our Year 9 students who will be picking their Key Stage Four 'Option' subjects. There will be an opportunity for students, parents and carers to find out more about these subjects at Options Evening on Thursday 6th February. Please talk to your child about the subjects they are thinking of choosing and encourage them to begin speaking to their teachers.

Please also be aware that parents of our Year 9 'The Derby Challenge' cohort will be invited in early (4:30pm) on Options Evening for further support and guidance on how best to support their child in reaching their full potential.

















All Year 11 students have now received their examination results from Mock Window One and should have a clear revision plan in place to address any underperformance; the most obvious opportunity to address any issues will come from Monday 27th January when their second (and final) Mock Window begins. To be prepared for the rigour of these examinations, Year 11 students should be working at home for a minimum of two hours every evening and attending intervention sessions each day (outlined below). The duration of their independent revision should increase at weekends and holiday period; at these points, their out-of-class study should last for a minimum period equivalent to a 'regular school day'. In the school building, intervention sessions are an important tool for staff and students to focus revision on key areas of need identified in mock examinations and classroom assessment and all students should be regularly attending these interventions in all relevant areas of study:

Week A

Monday – Science
Tuesday – Maths
Wednesday – Computer Science, Food, French and IT
Friday – Expressive Arts (Art, Creative Media, Dance, Drama, Music and Photography)

Week B

Monday – English Tuesday – Geography and History Wednesday – Health and Social Care, PE and RE Friday – Business, Engineering and Technology

- Go to the app store on your mobile device and search for "The Derby High School App"

- Create your user for the app, using the email address you have provided to school as your contact.
- You will then receive an email with your activation code.
- Open the app and sign in and your account will be linked to your child.
- Make sure that you allow notifications from the app so that you know when information has been sent to you.


