

- Black blazer (Derby High badge)
- Black jumper (optional)
- Black trousers (not skintight and must be full length)
- Black Derby High School skirt
- Headscarf (if worn) is black
- Derby High School tie (provided by school)
- Plain black leather/leather like shoes (no logos or trainers)
- No jewellery (wristwatch allowed **not smart watch**)
- No visible piercings including 'clear' piercings
- No plasters over piercings
- No unnatural hair colours including hair extensions
- No makeup, including lash extensions/nail extensions/varnish



Footwear



What do we mean by 'black leather, leather type shoes?'



Footwear reminder: All black/leather type shoes are allowed. If the footwear looks like a trainer, it is NOT allowed.

- No logos, oversized buckles or metal detailing or brightly coloured laces.
- No Fashion shoes e.g., high heels, open toes or slip-on shoes are not suitable.
- No Boots or shoes above the ankle should not be worn if wearing a skirt.


